As most of you know, we have been working on bringing Swallows back to the Rochester New York area. It has finally happened. The Pigeon Fanciers Association of Rochester held their annual show on November 16, 2003. There were 59 Swallows shown out of the 900 birds there.

Most of the Swallows were the Silesian variety in red, yellow, black, silver and blue barless, blue and silver checks, blue black bars, red spangles, and cream bar. In the Fairy section we had red white bars, black white bars and one young cream bar. There also were a couple full heads. So you can see there was a nice variety of color and patterns.

It sure got the interest of the other exhibitors, as the Swallow section was the first thing you saw when you walked in the door. The Rochester Club supplied our area with a gazebo type cage which Merle Starr volunteered to fill with some of the breeds that he raises that we normally do not see in our area. This brought a lot of attention to our area all day. Bob Fragoman's silver barless took Best of Show. Dick Baker got Reserve with a silver check hen. A full show report will be sent in at a later date.

Merle Starr, the Eastern Director graciously volunteered to be our judge as he is as interested in seeing Swallows return to the east as we are. He did a wonderful job judging and taught us all a lot about showing Swallows. He explained how he was going to judge the Swallows with the rating system and took the time to comment on every bird. He had his comments recorded on the back of every card so we could review his comments later. This was really helpful as we are all new Swallow breeders and this information will be extremely helpful. Several times Merle commented "there are some great birds here, but they need to be put in show condition". After the judging was over, he showed us how that pulling a feather or two or trimming a crest sometimes could raise the rating a whole point.

Everyone was well pleased with the job that he did. His comment was "if you guys are going to put this much effort into promoting Swallows, I will be glad to come back next year to judge your show again". This made all of us very pleased as we know how hard it is to get a qualified judge.

The whole area where the Swallows were shown was decorated with three large tables filled with all kinds of Swallow information for which we received a \$15 award. We had USC membership blanks, proposed standard, and several past Bulletins. We also had some articles that were taken from early American Pigeon Journals. Some were on the early days of Swallow breeding in the Rochester area and the starting of the first Swallow Club. These items were what were displayed on our information table. On the decoration tables we displayed two original M. Frank Cook paintings, a painting done by Gloria Weisgram, two prints by Gary Romig, several reprints of Cook paintings and a 1926 National Geographic that had a very large article in it on pigeons, with one section

of it on Swallows. There were several other Swallow related items. We also had two wonderful cobalt blue plates that had Swallows etched on them, made by Penny Smith. They had to bee seen to be appreciated, she made three of them. One she gave to Merle Starr, one to me and the other was donated to the Swallow Club raffle and was won by Robin Fragoman. Merle donated a nice pair of red barless clean leg Swallows, won by Herbie Baker. The Baker family donated a pair of blue checker muff spots, a copy of an M. Frank Cook painting, won by Allen Bitters and a gallon of natural apple cider vinegar, won by Bob Fragoman. This made for a successful raffle taking in \$76. The best part of it was, Larry Morrison won the pair of muff Swallows and came right over and signed up to be a member of the United Swallow Club. There were four more people who wanted to become members and will as soon as they come and get birds. I have promised to give each one of them two pair of Swallows to get started. That will make five new members from this show for the Central New

The Rochester Democrat & Chronicle sent a reporter to our show and he did a nice article. I have gotten at least one call everyday since with questions about pigeons. People are interested but do not know where to get answers and help.

Now I have kept the best part for last, I would like to thank all the Swallow people that made this possible, without them it would have not happened. Penny and Al Smith, Scott and Ann Coapman, Bob Fragoman, Allen Bitters, Joe Albrecht, Dorothy Baker, and Herbie Baker for showing their birds. Two other Swallow members, Bob Fish and Maylou Cook who came to show their support, promised to try to have Swallows to show next year. A very special thanks goes to Merle Starr, our Eastern Director for all the time and extra effort he put forth to help make this a successful show. Also a thanks to the Swallow Club members who have supplied us with all the birds to get started. So you can see, a dream can come true if enough people get behind it. Swallows are once again being shown in Rochester New York.

Tim Starr showed a nice Red Barless Clean Leg Spot. I gave that bird and "E" also. The Reds overall seem to be improving.


Next year we need to promote the show a little more. It truly is a fall extravaganza.



I was invited by the Australian Color Pigeon Group to judge swallows and Color Pigeons at the 2003 Australian National Show in Melbourne last July. I turned down an invitation in July 2002 due to the birth of my first granddaughter and recommended Hans Schipper who did the honors that year. Keith and Joan Fitzgerald whom I stayed with for the duration of the show met me at the Melbourne airport.

I was excited to make the trip for several reasons. It gave me a chance so see old friends who visited the States and stayed with me. Gave me a chance to see their large and wonderful country, most of which was traveled by auto. Gave me a chance to stay with families to see how they live and, of course, gave me a chance to see the swallows and color pigeons of Australia.

There were more that 100 swallows in most colors and markings except fullheads. This was a typical swallow show in that some color groups were more highly developed than others were as we see here in North America and in Europe. The champion swallow of the show was a wonderful Black W/B Fairy Old Hen. This bird had super type, style, color and muffs and the bar shape was great. The second best bird of the show was an exceptional blue W/B Silesian hen. Breeding import fairy blood with Australian silesian blood created this bird.

The blue W/B fairy classes were the most impressive with the most exhibitors involved. There were especially two young cocks that impressed me and found out later that they were related to the silesian hen mentioned above. One concern I had with this class was that there were far too many birds with over-sized rosettes and recommended these birds be eliminated from their programs as time allowed.

The Color Pigeon group was a friendly bunch of blokes. Darren Rafton had many good birds in several varieties and colors. Darren imported birds several years ago and has made the most of it. One thing I requested of Darren when I sent the birds was that he make birds available to other Aussie fanciers and I can say he's done a great job of that. Ron Wilton didn,t show much in the Color Pigeon section but when I visited his home he had several groups of color pigeons that would have done well. I visited Richie Darling and his father Terry at their home and they have some great pigeons. Richie is the color pigeon breeder and is doing a great job. 
