His contribution although his life was cut short will live on, providing a foundation for the next European Club President to build upon. Our friend will leave some very large shoes to fill, but thanks to him, he has made it easier by paving the way for our hobbies international future... I am sad to inform you that one of our club members, Andreas Meyer of Drebach, Germany, has passed away. According to his son, Christian, he collapsed on the evening of Thursday, May 5, 2005 at home. He was rushed to the hospital, subsequently transferred to a larger hospital where he

He was very active in many local pigeon clubs, president of the Sonderverein der Züchter Sächsischer Flugel Schwalben und Schildtauben and served on the board of the VDT. Andreas was well respected as a breeder of red spangle fairy swallows and also as a judge of color pigeons. His friendly personality, willingness to help and knowledge of our hobby made him a popular and well-known fancier.

On a personal note, Elliot Yeske and myself through an introduction from Hans Schipper, had become close friends with Andreas Meyer and his family. In recent years there were several visits to his house, other pigeon fancier friends of his and long discussions about our hobby. I am sure our hobby will miss him. Elliot and I will miss a good friend.

A Tip From Your Central District Director

Bob Benson Hello fellow swallow breeders.

How's your breeding season sor far? In Minnesota February, and even March nights can be tough on your swallows of banding age!

I put my birds together the first of February, so the first hatchlings

were arriving in early March. This year each night was approximately 10° F. and would rise to approximately 20° F. in the heat of the day. I'm fortunate that most of the hens sit tight day and night. When the young are 8-9 days old, I put fresh bedding of cedar chips in each nest. This helps to keep the youngsters warm and dry.



I was forced to aid one hen that wasn't covering her chicks well. I used a size six child's cotton stocking. I cut a very small hole in the toe of the sock; the sock was then pulled over the squab with the head protruding from said hole. Next, I cut openings for the wings (where the wings meet the body), pull them through and repeat the process with the legs. The last step is to cut off excess stocking so the vent isn't covered.

The parents are not put off by the white covering; they feed the young as usual. After a week the squabs will have almost out grown their coat, so just cut of the wrapping and out pops a beautiful swallow.

What do you Canadians and other cold climate breeders do to protect early hatches at age 10 days to 17 days?

the answer is –anything to get the birds ready for the National Young Bird Show of October each year!

I would like to write you and to continue my father's correspondence. First your questions: I'm 24 years old. My brothers are 19 and 16 years old.

We want to keep my father's pigeons and to carry on with breeding. But it's not easy. I'm a student in Dresden, a bigger city approx. 100 km away from Drebach. So I can only use the weekend to look after the birds. I hope my brothers will support me. We don't have nearly as much knowledge as my father had about breeding birds. We watched him sometimes and helped him a little with his hobby, but when it comes to making pairs, we are almost lost. We have to figure everything out from the beginning. We are lucky our grandfather (my father's dad) is also a huge pigeon friend. For the time being he now has control over my Dad's birds and step by step me and my brothers will continue to raise my father's birds. I hope everything will go fine to keep my father's legacy alive.

My mother is doing well under the given circumstances. Though she can speak a little bit English, I have to translate every Mail from America. She is always happy to hear from you and she is sending her regards.

"My birds are now in the fourth round. This is the last round for this year. I have now banded a little bit more than 90 young birds. Over 70 of this birds are Swallows. This is realy enough and I have no bands for more young birds. The birds from the first and the second round are moulting and it seems as there will come up some real nice young birds. It seems as I will get some nice red spangled Silesians and also Fairys. I don't know if I





told you in spring that I like to try to breed more spangled birds as in the years before. In the years before I mated together more barred pairs. In this year I had only one pair Silesians and one pair Fairys red white bar. The other pairs were spangle/spangle or red white bar/spangle. Now it seems as I had some good luck. Attached are a few fotos I took a couple of days ago, so you can see how they are looking".

Message from the President Merle Starr

Spring at last, spring at last. I hope all members have started their breeding season. I have quite a few young banded already.

We had a very good turn out for the voting for the annual site and for the annual judge this time. Close to 50 percent of the membership voted.

This will be a first in several ways for the site and for the judge. This will be the first time that the USC will have their annual show in Canada (Edmonton) and the first time that I am aware of for having a foreign judge (Hans Schipper) judging two years in a row at our annual show. Having Hans judge for the second year in a row is possible in that the Edmonton Pigeon Club will be picking up all the cost for Hans trip.

We had several members that were uncertain as to how to vote with two foreign judges on the ballot. I admit that I could have made it a lot clearer in that Hans could only be voted for the Edmonton show and that Reiner Wolf could only be voted to judge at the NPA national in San Bernardino. This is again due to both foreign judges were already asked to judge these two sites prior to our (USC) election for the site and for the judge. Both of the judges costs will be paid by other clubs, and not by the USC.

Our by-laws state that we should rotate our judge and our site for our annual show on a yearly basis, but if there are extenuating circumstances we can go to club officers and make an exception. Since we had clubs other than the USC paying for all cost to bring in foreign judges, we felt that this would be alright this time. While all officers of the club had no objections to this ballot, some said that they may or may not vote for Edmonton or San Bernardino or for either foreign judge. There were several members saying that they intended showing some birds at the Edmonton show.

This is our year for election of officers for the next two years. If you have some one in mind for any office I suggest you contact them to see if they would accept any position in the club before nominating them. I have talked with most officers about staying on in their official position. They have agreed to accept this position for the next two years. You can either nominate the current officer on you may nominate some one else of your choice. Mike Swanson has requested to have someone replace him as chairman of the judging committee. This can be nominated with the rest of your nominations but the nominators must be from the list of current official USC judges.

Send all your nominations to Tim Starr at timstarr@comcast.net by the 31st of July. This will give us ample time to have the ballot ready for our summer bulletin.

It is with my deepest sympathy for the family of Andreas Meyer in his unexpected passing away several weeks ago. He was a true friend to all pigeon people, and will really be missed.
