It has been a busy January and February lots of dues coming in and many band orders. As of right now we are sold out of the muffed bands and currently have 61 clean leg bands and 30 of those are suppose to be sold as well.

So 31 clean leg band left is all. I want to thank everyone that has supported the club with your band orders. I have sent in the first half of our 2004 order we ordered 2000 muffed bands and 1000 clean leg bands this up from the 500 clean leg bands we ordered this year. I hope as a club we will be able to sell all of the bands next year. The NPA made us order 1000 clean leg bands they would not order only 500. Gloria and I talked about it and we thought that with the growing interest in the clean legs we should be able to sell more next year.

The Hartford National was a great show, a very nice group of birds. Us poor people up in the northern frozen tundra just about were not able to show at Hartford. Gloria and I tried to mail out birds fron the Fargo North Dakota post office the day before we were to fly to Hartford only to have them rejected because the Temps in Fargo were below 10 above so I had to take our birds with me to the Airport in Mpls. Minnesota and mail them there luckly it was above ten degrees in Mpls. Another highlight of the Hartford National was that members were treated to be able to visit the loft of Howard Angevine. Howard has a wonderful setup for his lofts and many nice birds. I really ejoyed the visit and was even able to get a couple of birds from Howard. He is really coming on strong in the clean legs and done well the imports he received from Germany.

Hope everyone has a good breeding season, here up north I have a few birds in the heated part of my loft and so far have 4 clean fullheads banded. Also clean leg breeders take note that the bands we received from the NPA this year for the clean legs are one mm smaller than they should be I talked to Bill Tietze the Sec. of the Archangel club and it also happened to them so watch your young and band them a little bit early. I did make not eof this problem to Pat Avery the Sec. of the NPA and we are suppose to get the 8mm size for next year.

I had a great time in Hartford at the NPA National Show! It was a great place to hold our annual meet. The hosts of the show did a great job!

I want to thank our club for the privilege to judge. Every one was very hospitable. As usual the judging took most of Friday. We got a late start but were able to finish. That left Saturday for relaxing and fellowship.

There were about 60 birds entered, half Cleanleg and half muffed. I'm sorry to say that there were no muffed Fullheads entered. It's funny how the popularity of some varieties go up and down. Thirty Cleanlegs was a large entry. Half were Fullheads and half were Spots. I wasn't sure what to expect when handling that many of the Cleanlegs so I decided to warm up on the muffed Fairys. The quality of the birds was very nice. They were mostly blue white bar with at least two of them going HS! The blacks shown were good colored and I even got to look at a nice yellow white bar. I would have liked to rate it a little higher but it was a little small in body type but nice in every other respect.

Next were the Silesians. They were the best as a group over all. I gave two E ratings and considered two more. One of the birds was a blue barless old cock that ended up champion of the show. It had beautiful color and great feather quality. The young cock class may have been the best. One blue black bar was also rated E. It had it all, bar, color, muffs. It won reserve champion and best young bird. Another young cock was a beautiful blue check. It was a dream of a bird and was rated HS, just missing the E rating. There were also nice silver checkers in this group with a couple of them going HS.

Next I judged the Cleanleg Spots. They were mostly reds and yellows with two black barless and a nice blue white bar. Two of the red barless were outstanding in color. One was rated E, as it had a little more type in body than the one that was rated HS. Both were nice birds in great show condition.

The Cleanleg Fullheads consisted of black barless and blue black bar with best going to a nice blue barless. The overall quality of the birds in the show was good. I don't remember seeing thirty Cleanlegs before. It was fun being able to handle so many nice birds of so many different colors and varieties.

In 1995 Bill Greibel Sr. initiated the program to bring the red and yellow swallow up to the quality of the blue,silver, and the black swallows.

Well, Bill that day came on friday Jan.17th 2003 at the great Hartford N.P.A. national ,when Tim Starr entered a red barless Thuringer swallow young cock bird. Judge Perry Mueller gave it an (E) rating. Unfortunately Tim could not be present due to several work related agendas. He was very happy to hear this when I called him later that evening. Congratulations Tim. This is to my knowledge the first red or yellow swallow to get an E rating in the states. I am not sure if this has happened in Canada, or not. There are however several very good breeders in Canada that have excellant red and yellow swallows. This equates to breaking the four minute mile in the track and field event in the Olympic games. After the four minute mile was eclipsed for the first time, several top athletes ran sub four minutes miles within a short time. I am sure that there will be many more high quality red and yellow swallows in the future of the U.S.C. shows both here in the states and Canada to get E ratings.

We have had quite a few U.S.C. club members since that day in 1995 to start their own programs in red and yellows. many of these breeeders have made great advances with their red and yellows. Most if not all top blue, silver and black breeders have added red and yellow swallows to their breeding programs also. Their expertise will undoubtably will help raise the quality in our future shows. I now wonder how long will it be before a red or yellow will be judged the best in the show. Not long I hope.

The club has decided that this was the last show to have the special award for red and yellows. Is it to soon, I do not know, only time will tell. I am sure that this program has raised the quality of the red and yellow swallows.

At any rate Bill, I want to take this time to personally thank you for your insight in initiatally starting this program . I am sure the rest of the red and yellow breeders think the same as I do. This has really gave the red and yellows a big boost, and I am sure it made this first E rating possible.

As you can see from our membership list, we have only a handful of breeders in the Southern United States. I am going to work with current members in the south to start a "sectional" meet in Texas or Oklahoma. The United Swallow Club should also capitalize on the fact that the National Pigeon Association Annual Show is in the south this year, in Birmingham, Alabama.

I encourage you the members of the USC to select Birmingham as the United Swallow Club Annual Meet when you vote both during the nomination process and in our final ballot this summer. I will step forward to act as the member in charge at the USC Annual Meet in Birmingham and take care of the show arrangements. I believe we have a golden opportunity to shine in an area of the country where relatively few people have or see Swallows on a regular basis.

CALGARY 2002 By Bill Griebel Sr.

Thanks to the invite by the Calgary Stampede people I had the opportunity to fly to Calgary in December 2002 to judge fancy pigeons on the grounds of the Calgary Stampede exhibition facility. The show superintendent picked me up at the airport and we went straight to the show room where I talked with many of the fanciers I met two years earlier when judging in Edmonton. The next day myself along with another judge from Eastern Canada, Mike Carson of Show Racer fame, set out to judge all the fancy pigeons at the 1600 bird show. I cautiously looked forward to the assignment knowing that I had 200 swallows waiting for me.

If you think about it, 200 swallows at one show would be quite a challenge. When you realize that I believe our largest show over the last 20 years was the 1998 San Bernardino National with 160 swallows the Calgary show presented itself as a giant task – and it was. Of the 200 swallows, 120 were clean legs and 46 were blue black bar Silesian swallows. The CL's rivaled the best CL's I saw in Nurmberg in 2000 and the Blue Silesians were tops. The swallows in Western Canada today without a doubt would place at or near the top spots at any of the USC show in the U.S.

To me the most difficult group to judge was the Blue black bar classes. In all there were about 46 birds. As you can see from the results there were a lot of good ones. They were very consistent in quality throughout all four classes and a credit to the breeders.

The clean leg classes were for the most part high in quality. What impressed me most in the CL's was that throughout all the colors, (blue, silver, red, yellow and

black) the type was consistent. No small birds in this color group and large birds in another group. They were all the same style. If there was a disappointment in the CL's, it was the black class – they didn't seem to have the good color that I saw two years earlier.

The winners were:

Champion: Black W/B wing pigeon OH bred by John Taupert. This bird would win tops in its class anywhere it was shown.

Res. Champ: Blue barless Thuringer YH bred by Bernie Licht. This bird was also best young. It is tough for a young bird to beat the old birds but this one was a dandy.

I'd like to thank John Taupert for all the work he did to bring this show together and give me the opportunity to judge this show. John spent many hours on the phone twisting arms to make this 200 bird show a reality. John organized a shipment of swallows and color pigeons several years ago and now they are thriving in Western Canada. There hasn't been this much activity there since the days of Gunter Prusse. If there are any USC awards to be given out for going above and beyond the call of duty, John should receive one.

Finally, I got to renew an old friendship with Ron Hornby who I talked to many times on the phone years ago when he was the Canadian District Director. He helped steward the show while I judged and he kept me organized. Thanks Ron.

BANDING YOUNG SWALLOWS

Dick Baker

This is a tip that may help the new Swallow breeders. I have had a problem in the past with keeping the bands above the hocks or not being able to get the bands on. I will try to explain what I do now. With this process you can band a squab at a younger age and the band slides on very easily.

I save the light weight twist ties that come on loaves of bread. I run the tie through the band and give a half twist before I attempt to band a squab. Now slide the band to the proper position on the leg with the loose ends of the ties pointed towards the feet. Wrap the tie around the leg below the band and fasten it lightly. This will prevent the band from sliding down until the hock feathers get long enough to hold it in place. Make sure to leave room for the leg to grow so that you do not cut off the circulation. In five to ten days the tie can be removed. Don't forget to do it as it could cause damage to the leg or the feathers. After you do one or two you will see it doesn,t take much to hold the band in place.

In the past I would squeeze the aluminum bands to hold them in place. Now the bands are plastic and I am unable to do this. I used this system last year with the aluminum bands and it worked very well. If you have any problems or questions, Contact me.

A History of Frank Bailey's Black White Barred Fullhead Swallows

Hello,

My name is Frank Bailey and I live in Snohomish, Washington here in the United States. I am 57 years old and I have raised pigeons for 48 years or since 1955. I was introduced to and have raised the Swallow Pigeon since 1970 while living in Southern California. But since 1978, my focus has been on the acquiring and improvement of the Saxon White Barred Fullhead Swallows in the colors of Red, Yellow and primarily in Black.

My love for the Black Fullhead began in 1971 when I first saw a Black Barless Fullhead at the Annual Pageant of Pigeons Show held in Los Angeles, California. It was bred and owned by Steve Ball of So. Calif. and I have never forgotten the beauty noted that day. From that day forward, I vowed to someday raise them but in White Bars. Only to soon learn that these were very rare and nearly impossible to obtain and White Bars were even rarer.

Here we are, 32 years later and this season I have proudly selected and mated up 15 quality pairs of Blacks, 5 pairs of Reds and 4 pairs of Yellows. All in Saxon Fullhead Swallows with White Bars! My favorite color and life time focus is with the Blacks. As mentioned above, this rare breed in North America has been and remains very limited in availability for well over thirty years now. In addition to raising off spring from what was available here in America, I have imported three times from three separate breeders in Germany (1993, 1995 and 2001). My reasoning for importing originally from Germany, was to get ahold of quality breeding stock not available here in the USA. Latter imported material was selected to improve the white bar quality and raise the number of Saxon Swallows carrying import blood here in the USA. Promising myself to respect the origin and the vision that the fore fathers had for this beautiful breed in Saxony Germany dating back to the late 1800's and early 1900's.

Only those familiar with this beautiful breed, can truly appreciate the challenges found in raising them. The fact that both in North America as well as in Europe, the breed has been out crossed several times in an effort to make a perfect specimen! The Black White Barred Fairy has been introduced since the origin of the White Bar Fullheaded Swallow. Overall, it has improved the type, markings and color and yet in one area it has hurt the breed. It's the dominate spot factor found in the Fairy over the recessive and yet required full cap we're looking for in the Fullhead. Resulting in high numbers of short capped birds. Here in the USA, the breed has been crossed with the Black Barless Fullheads in order to enhance the full cap, bigger bodies, fuller and larger muffs and nice stationing. Even though several positive attributes were achieved, this process has made it difficult to see and maintain the bar quality we find in the Fairy Swallow. So the challenge I have elected to master has been very expensive and has brought a great deal of disappointment over the years. But progressively each of the 24 breeding seasons has shown great promise for achieving my goal. Today my great fortune of having this many pairs of this rare breed, is now allowing me to select a few babies from nearly 100. This results in the selection of higher quality for my breeding future instead of having to choose inferior material from just a few F-1's each season.

My short term goal is to achieve progressive growth each season. My long term goal is to simply earn the respect from my peers in the Swallow fancy. For an achievement that took a life time of dedication to a breed that's rarely found in the world.

My advise to anyone with a like challenge is the same advise Bill Griebel Sr. gave me many years ago. He said: "You have to have a vision and then the patience it takes to achieve it!" He was right!
