Perry Mueller's New Loft

I had some time this spring and some space left in the back yard so I thought I'd build a new loft. My intent was to tear down the 4x8 I have now and build two twin 8x8's. One for breeding 12 pair of red and yellow clean legs and one for their young. I got the young bird pen built now and I may re-think the breeding loft. These lofts take time and money. Also, I'm up to about 50 pair of Swallows and Archangels and it's starting to turn into work to keep things clean and maintained. Included are some photos and I hope you find them interesting and helpful.

When building, I always use 2' increments, plywood, and siding comes in 4x8 pieces so there is little waste. I construct the floor with 2x4 or 2x6 joists with ¾ plywood. It is supported with 4, 4x4 posts cemented 30" in the ground. The walls are constructed with 4x8 weather proof siding nailed to 2x4 studs. Ten-foot 2x4's work great for a shed roof on an 8x8. It will give you 6" overhang on the back and 18" or so in front. I changed the roof style on this one; the loft looked too tall so I did some modifications.



Notice the vent on the side. I've found this works great. I close it in the winter along with putting plastic over the door. In the spring, the plastic comes off the door. By summer the lower vent is opened letting dust flow out and fresh air in. I like making the doors small to help prevent the birds from escaping. Nailing 1x6 boards, together works great. I believe fly pens are a must. I use 2x2's painted three times, then covered with hardware cloth and chicken wire. This lasts five

or ten years then I take them down, repaint and make new ones. For perches I cut a 3" or 4" circle and nail it to a 1x2 board 12" long. I fasten them to the 2x4 studs right over the top of each other. I don't have a problem of them soiling each other. Nesting boxes can vary. I've used 12"x24"x12" high, 2'x2'x2' high with a shelf and even 12"x12"x12" high. They all work fine. I suppose the style depends on the breed.

I have bred several over the past three season and here is one that I bred late last fall that doesn't look too bad and should assist me next season. It is a young cock - not great but they are getting better and I will put it back into the pure Fullhead's next year".

The committee of the club decided that Kurt Melzer and Christoph Prager should become honorary members of the club because of their great commitment and successful breeding over many decades.

Klaus Burkhardt appealed to all breeders to present their birds not only at the shows in the region of the Erz Mountains but also in other federal states of Germany. Due to the variety and elegance of our fantastic Saxon swallows we expect to gain friends and new breeders in the future.

Like last year we will be presenting the swallows in aviaries at the German Masters VDT in Leipzig. Klaus Hentschel will present Saxon Fullheads in red white bars, Christoph Prager will show Saxon Silesian Swallows in blue black bars, Wendelin Heidrich Saxon Silesian red checkered and Reiner Wolf Saxon Shields in red white bars.

The leader of the club's Group North-West, Friedrich Schröder, was excused and so Herbert Wohlfeil reported on the work from the group.

This year we have also had an election in our swallow club. Klaus Burkhardt as the president, Mario Doehler as the treasurer and Wendelin Heidrich as committee member were confirmed.

After the election the president talked about the coming show season. Reiner Wolf reported from the last meeting of the European Poultry Organization.

We got a new standard for the Saxon Shields and this standard is valid throughout Europe.

The board of the next European Show from our Saxon birds presented its poster and the breeder Günter Kühnert donated the flag for this show. Breeders around the world are welcome to this big event.

The biggest part of the meeting was the discussion about the youngsters from 2009 and the preparation for the show season. Our special judges Franz Oppl, Reiner Wolf, Wilfried Metzner and Jörg Kühne evaluated the pigeons and gave the breeders some proposals for the show and the breeding next year. The judges especially talked about the color, the body form and the muffs. Included are some pictures of the meeting.
