President's Message Chris Auer

Hello all USC members!!

I hope everyone is doing well and looking forward to the upcoming breeding season.

On January 20-22 the USC held it's 2021 annual meet in Amarillo. I think I can speak for everyone that attended that a good time was had by all. Here are the key happenings:

The highlight of the event was Cathy and Mike Swanson receiving the NPA Master Breeder Award for Swallows on Friday night at the NPA banquet - good job and congratulations to Cathy and Mike!!!

The number of swallows actually exhibited was down this year but that did not limit the quality of the entries. Bill Griebel took champion honors with a nice Black White Bar Silesian, congrats Bill and good job (complete show report is included in this bulletin).

Also, a big thank you goes to Steve Ripper for doing the judging this year!!!

The auction was a great success with \$1530 being raised for the USC treasury. Many nice pairs of birds went home to new lofts. Highlights were a nice pair of silver barless silesians from Mike and Cathy going for \$260 to Randy Wick, a pair of black spangle fairies from Perry Mueller going to Dave Gazaway for \$250 and a pair of black white bar silesians donated by Bill Griebel going for \$230 to Ron Smith. 5 more pair of birds brought the nice sum of \$615 (donated by Ron Smith, Mike/Cathy and Bill). All the birds went for over \$100 a pair. Pigeon related items were donated by Bill Griebel, Ron Smith, Brian Goodwin and myself. A big thank you goes out to those that donated and bid on the items this year.

The annual meeting reached a fever pitch a couple of times but I think we had some good discussions and a few ideas came up this

year that should help build some energy and hopefully help attract new members. In the next couple of months we will have to have discussions on how we implement some of the subjects that were voted on and passed. Full notes from the meeting are later in this bulletin.

I received a text from Brian Goodwin a couple of days ago, the "local" club in his area is putting on a show on November 11, 2022 in Littlefield, TX (near Lubbock). He asked if any USC members were interested in having a meet there. Talk about it and let your Central district director (Perry Mueller) know if there is sufficient support to have a meet.

Well, it is that time of the year again, if you plan on renewing your USC membership please send Elliot your dues. Also, please order your bands for 2022, orders have been relatively slow especially with the clean leg size. If we have too many left over this year we will be forced to reduce the number we order for 2023.

Of course we will have our normal shows in Louisville and DesMoines, I have heard we may have a meet in Lancaster and our new Western district director would like to hold a meet in Salt Lake this year plus you never know about the Pageant. Plus maybe there are a few sleepers out there. Southern Classic maybe? St. Louis?

USC Annual Meeting minutes (1/21/22)

Minutes from 2019 annual meeting were reviewed by Pres Chris Auer. Minutes are covered in the 2020 Bulletin #2

Key points:

- Chris Auer expressed 3 reasons for being a member of the USC: Fun, Camaraderie, breeding/exhibiting birds
- Need to increase participation in the club
- Need for more participation for our bulletins
- Need for a New Member chairperson (Jim Grober has filled this position)
- Rachel Stuckey will be Election Chairperson for 2020/2021 (Rachel will continue as Election Chairperson for 2022/2023)
- Need for new USC patch (new patches were made in late 2021)
- Motion passed in 2020 annual meet to make awards for the German Swallow and Color pigeon clubs. (Gary made and send awards but due to covid shows have been cancelled in Germany for the past 2 years)
- On and passed in 2020 meeting. (Pamphlets were produced and available at this show)

•Motion was made by Steve Ripper to change the muffed Swallow band size from an 11 to a 12. After much discussion a vote was taken - Passed. (note - if you have an issue with this change please contact Chris Auer. We could split our order between 11's and 12's if needed)

•Steve Ripper brought up the need to study and propose what we want our judging and holding coop areas to "look" like at our meets. This could include things like pop-up banners, breed banners, new signage for judging table and behind judging area, etc. After discussion Pres Chris Auer asked Steve Ripper to lead a small committee to make a recommendation to the executive committee. Steve accepted the assignment

•Pres Chris Auer brought up an idea brought to him from an unnamed USC member on how to improve participation with new members. The idea was that the club could reimburse the new member for entry fees to a USC district or annual meet. Much discussion was had on the subject and the following conditions were outlined:

- A new member is someone that is within their first 2 years of membership, People that join, drop out and rejoin are only eligible during the 1st 2 years of membership (no redo's)
The reimbursement is only good for 1 show and limited to 4 birds

- This "program" is to be reviewed annually and revoked upon after a 3 year period as to determine if it should continue (review should be held at the 2024 annual meeting)

Motion was made by Bill Griebel. 2nd by Mike Swanson - motion passed

•Much discussion was had about how to increase the pool of certified judges. Discussion included: including the training on NON USC members to become a certified judge and paying for transportation of trainee judges to meets to expedite their completion of qualifications. No formal motion was made, review to be continued with a proposal for the membership to me made in the future

Mike Swanson made a motion to adjourn at 2:48PM, 2nd by Bill Griebel - motion passed

In talking with Chris Auer about the clubs auction birds, that were unselfishly donated by a few of our awesome members, he asked if I would write about my experience in bidding on these birds as I couldn't make it to the Nationals. I originally heard of the birds being donated on the USC Facebook members page. Then a few pictures of the donated birds surfaced and it really got me excited! Being that I have been involved in pigeon clubs for years and being in charge of fundraisers etc., I know how important it is for the club to have a little "nest egg" (pun intended) to help with expenses. So my plan was to not only bid, but to hopefully raise some excitement with other members of the club to get the money ball rollin'.

My first few bids were offered online on the clubs facebook page. I should also mention here that I also had a few members of our local pigeon club here in Utah, going to the show and they would be able to transport any birds I may win, back home.

Now, knowing full well if I truly wanted the birds up for grabs, it would be well over the starting bid. But I put my first 2 offers in on the 2 pair I was interested in. My bids DID peak the interest of a few other members and the birds prices did start rising. So I stopped bidding....for now! Haha!

ON TO THE AUCTION!! As I mentioned before, it isn't my first time being involved in a live auction as I have WAY to many hobbies and have bid on things from guided duck hunts to racing pigeons to backpacking trips etc. However, this was the first time doing the process over the phone. Which honestly added to the excitement of the unknown and unseen as I was not there to take in the surroundings.... How many people were there? How many people wanted the pairs I was after? So in texting Chris, he mentioned I would get a LIVE call from the show to help assist me with bidding. With me working Saturdays as a whole, I knew it could be an issue but was hopeful I could answer the phone call and get bidding!! Well...I was able to get that call and it came from Mr. Brad Stuckey. In conversation, I missed out on one pair so I was now after the black spangled. I could hear other members over the phone yelling numbers and could just hear the excitement in the air (which got me going!) So before I knew it, I was throwing out offers and long story short, I won what I was after (birds pictured above) and couldn't be happier with all the club members involved in making this happen! It was fun, easy and truly a great experience! It was also great talking

with Brad about birds and other hobbies. Thank you Brad for your help!

With all this being said and done, I got to thinking...technology has made it much easier for things like this to happen and I would encourage others to use the resources that we have to help assist with the club fundraisers, help with future shows and with getting the word out about our club. I truly believe that those that raise pigeons, and those that are new to it, they only need a little nudge from us all to get them raising these fabulous birds!! 1. Entries **MUST** be postmarked by Monday, April 18, 2022.
2. Open entry fee is \$4.00 per bird. Youth entry fee is \$2.00 per bird.
3. No fee on sale birds. They must stay outside barn under the middle awning.
4. Make checks payable to West Texas Pigeon Fanciers and mail to Stephanie Langford at 201 NE Loop 289, Lubbock, TX 79403.
5. The Superintendent reserves the right to reject any and all entries which are deemed necessary.
6. There will be a Youth & Open Show. Please circle Y or O on entry form.
7. Barn will be open Saturday, April 30, 2022 at 6am.
8. Entry Times: Birds **MUST** be cooped by 8:30 am on Saturday.
9. Judging will begin Saturday, April 30th at 9:00 am and judges decision is final.
10. Release Time: Birds may be released as soon as awards are handed out on Saturday.
11. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding, watering, and caring for their own birds.
12. West Texas Pigeon Fanciers will **NOT** be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to person or pigeons.
13. Classes will be broken up as **FANCY, RARE, PERFORMING, & UTILITY**
14. Classes will be provided for Old Cocks, Old Hens, Young Cocks, & Young Hens.
15. Substitutes will be permitted when they are the same breed, color, sex, & class.
16. Birds will be judged in coops and winners brought to show table for Grand & Reserve.
17. All birds must be banded with NPA bands that are issued by the NPA or one of the NPA distributors. The only exceptions to this are AU, IF, Canadian, or other Foreign bands. Canadian and other Foreign bands will only be allowed if they are shown by exhibitors who live in those countries.. The number on the birds leg **MUST** match the entry form or bird will be disqualified. No personalized bands allowed.
18. All birds **MUST** be free of disease & parasites or will be disqualified.
19. No birds shall be handled except by owners, judges, or show volunteers. Utmost care will be used when handling all birds.
20. Any protest must be accompanied by a \$25.00 fee, refundable only if show committee has met and you win the protest that you filed.

RIBBONS will be awarded through 3rd place in Youth Show.
Best of Class Fancy, Rare, Performing, & Utility breeds will receive awards
Reserve of Class Fancy, Rare, Performing, & Utility breeds will receive an award.
Best in Show Champion pigeon will receive a buckle.
Reserve Show Champion pigeon will receive a buckle.
