Voting for a European Judge at the Annual Meet. What's Involved Anyway?

Initially it starts with some members expressing a desire to have a "European" Judge for the Annual Meet. It takes some discussion among members to decide on who the judge might be. In my opinion, it is desirable to have the judge speak some English. If they speak no English, for me, the experience is less enjoyable. Second, they have to be available. Availability is less of a problem if the Annual Meet is held in conjunction with the NPA Nat". District Shows and the Pageant are more problematic. We try to vote for an Annual Meet Judge and show site about a year in advance so people can plan. In Europe, for the larger shows, judges are scheduled out three years in advance in some cases. They too have problems finding enough judges. Thirdly, they have to be willing to travel. This is not always the case.

Once a potential judge is identified someone must contact the potential judge and find out if they are willing and available.

it is important to explain to them that first they are nominated and then voted on by club members before an official invitation can be extended.

If the European Judge is elected, a point person should be selected to be the main person to communicate with the judge. They can extend the official invitation and its acceptance, make reservations for show accommodations, confirm show dates, coordinate reimbursement of the judges travel expenses and answer other questions. This usually takes several emails. If this is the judge's first time it helps if they can speak to someone they know who might have judged here before.

There are several considerations for travel. Ticket cost is probably the most important. In recent years, it has included getting flight insurance too. What city should the judge fly out of and what city should their destination be? A number of European Cities only have direct flights to the U.S. once or twice a week. What about layovers and connecting flights? When should they arrive and depart? You can't expect the judge after travelling for 18 to 20 hours to get off the plane and go directly to the show hall and start judging. What happens if the flight is delayed a day?

A connecting flight arriving in Louisville would have been a great choice. However, there are no club members in Louisville to host the judge and no club members in the immediate area for loft visits. You have to have hosts which will pick the judge at the airport, provide food and lodging, get the judge to and from the show, provide food and lodging after the show if necessary and get them to the airport. Club member Perry Mueller and his wife Susie were the hosts. Thank you Perry and Susie.

So you are the judge. You travel all the way from Europe to the US and you don't get to do any sightseeing? So that responsibility also falls on the hosts. Keep in mind all the travel issues we deal with, the judge has to deal with most of them on their end too.

I haven't tried to include everything but hopefully you have a sense of the amount of work involved.

Postscript:

In my opinion when you vote to have a European Judge at an Annual Meet you are voting to support that endevor. Most members are able to help in one or more of three ways.

Helping to raise money to offset the related costs.

Having an entry in the show.

Attending the show.

I was very proud of the support shown by my fellow club members. I felt it was one of the more successful and enjoyable shows in recent club history. Thank all of you.:

Bill Griebel wins the Overall Grand Champion at the NPA Grand National

The United Swallow Club held their Annual Meet and show in conjunction with the National Pigeons Association Grand National in Louisville KY. It was a good competition with several high placing birds in all categories.

This year the Swallow Club was able to have a judge come from Germany. Thanks to the efforts of several members of the Club. For this show we had an outstanding Judge, Axel Nestler, from Germany. A special thanks goes to Perry Mueller for hosting Axel.

Axel did an incredible job of explaining the fine points of a good Swallow Pigeon. There were a lot of fine Swallows entered. At the end of 2 days work judging, Axel picked Bill Griebel's Black White Bar Saxon Wing Pigeon (Fairy Swallow) as the best Swallow of over 100 entries. The Winning Bird, an Old Hen, was one of several birds placed in the Highly Superior (HS96) ranking. Other Highly Superior birds included: Perry Mueller's Blue Barless Silesian, Jim Grober's Silver Dun Bar Silesian, and Chris Auer's Blue White Bar Silesian. In the Thuringer (Clean Legs) catagory Brian Goodwin won with a Blue Barless Fullhead and Ron Smith won with a Red Check Spot Swallow.

All in all, it was a great Swallow Pigeon Show with many members in attendance.

It has been the custom at NPA Grand National Shows, to have a Final Pick for the Top Bird in the Show. A total of 5,864 pigeons and 160 breeds.

Pigeon breeders started bringing their winning birds of all types into a line up at the end of the Show Hall. A Three Judge team, one from Scotland, Scott Sharp, and two from Australia, Phil Cleghorn and Alan Watts, did the judging.

The audience of breeders and spectators watched as the judges looked over all the birds. They worked quickly and had their main attention on a few birds. I sat with Bill Griebel as we watched the judging and we could see that the Judges were closely examining Bill's Black White Bar Fairy Swallow. In just a few seconds they picked Bill's bird as the Best in the Show! They then picked a very fine English Trumpeter belonging to John DeCarlo Sr. as the Second place bird and a White Jacobin of John Manckia was third. It was a thrilling end to the show for the United Swallow Club!

A Tribute to Werner Zahn (1936-2023)

Werner's parents emigrated from the city of Bieber, near Offenbach am Main to the Netherlands in the early 1900s. Werner was born in Arnhem in 1936 and attended school there as well but unfortunately the family had to leave the Netherlands due to the outbreak of World War 2 and the properties they had built up there were seized by the state. So, Werner spent his youth back in Germany in Offenbach-Bieber.

Werner inherited his love of pigeons from his father, who kept pigeons but was never so involved in the hobby as his son. Bitten by the pigeon bug, by 1951 Werner had Ice Pigeons and had exhibited them with some success in Hannover.

Werner completed an apprenticeship as a businessman working in his parent's business producing leather goods. It was also during this period that he met Erich Müller. In the coming years the two often traveled together and spent many wonderful hours together—always with something regarding pigeons!

Werner married his wife Rita in 1961 and they began their family in 1964 with the birth of their son Frank, who was born at home in Obertshausen. Rita was familiar with pigeon breeding because her family had also raised pigeons.

The Bieber small animal breeding association in Bavaria offered ideal conditions for pigeon breeding and beginning in 1951 Werner began breeding seriously, exhibiting for the first time in Hanover. At the same time, Werner developed a love for book collecting and exchanged books with Erich Müller and Karlheinz Sollfrank. His interest was not only in pigeon books but also chickens and other bird books. It's no surprise that he visited antique book stores in London, Amsterdam, Frankfurt and Munich. Additionally, many of the older breeders left him books to ensure they would remain in good hands.

With the increased popularity of pigeon breeding in the 1950s and 60s, Werner founded the Offenbach and Surrounding Areas Pigeon Club in 1967 and soon all of the well-known breeders of the region became members. It was also during this time that he studied and passed the requirements to become a recognized judge. He was a specialty judge for Saxon Color Pigeons and he bred Saxon Wing Pigeons, Swallows, and Shields until the end of his life.

His interest in his Saxon Wing Pigeons helped him make contacts throughout the world and one day Dr. L. E. Hummel from the USA, a great expert on Color Pigeons, visited him. The two looked at his pigeons and Werner asked the Dr. to assess the quality of his Wing Pigeons. He replied that the yellow and red ones were very nice, but the blue ones were behind in quality compared to those in the USA. Werner told me that he couldn't sleep for nights knowing there could be better Wing Pigeons elsewhere. He concluded: he had to go to America! This was the start of a series of visits, which would take him to the USA six times, several times with judging assignments at the American National Pigeon Shows. Of course, he also traveled around the country, always on the lookout for books to add to his collection. The Americans valued him and regarded him as an ambassador for German Color Pigeons in the USA. But he wasn't drawn just to the west! In the 1950s, he contacted Siegfried Wild from Zschocken/ Erzgebirge which resulted in a lifelong friendship. At first, he travelled by train, then later drove a Volkswagen Beetle over the mountains to the east. He had to drive through every village, because modern highways didn't exist yet.

Traditionally, the Zahn and Wild families spent the time around the

Pentecost holiday with each other, and in winter Werner made it a point to visit the main shows in the Erzgebirge area. Werner visited many well-known breeders who are now considered legends. With his friend Rudi Kreher, the two were seen as a team, attending all the important shows.

In fact, one can say that Werner Zahn attended every national and VDT show from the 1950s onwards, without a hitch until 2022. His ambition led to the holding of five VDT shows in Offenbach and Frankfurt am Main, even organizing a National in the Frankfurt fairgrounds under the leadership of his friend Dr. Werner Lüthgen, with him as first chairman of the Offenbach Pigeon Club. He also held the presidency of the pigeon club for 54 years and after retiring

from the office received the title of emeritus president. Likewise, he was on the board of the Frankfurt Bird Breeders Breeding Association founded in 1867 for many years.

In 1970, Werner Zahn took over as president of the Saxon Color Pigeon Club in West Germany, which Werner retained until the reunification of Germany. As part of the merger of the two German Color Pigeon Clubs he gave up the presidency and was appointed emeritus president. From then he was very active in the Saxon Wing, Swallow, and Shield Pigeons Club, serving as breed overseer for many years, ensuring that fanciers maintained and improved the quality of the breeds. His reports as chairman and breed overseer were always meaningful, future-oriented and, above all, complete. During the 1980s his literary activities brought us a complete treatise on the Saxon Color Pigeons in the pigeon and poultry magazines. Later, he included his expertise regarding the pigeon and poultry literature in his articles. In the "Columba" newsletter published annually by the Nuremberg Pigeon Museum, he was supportive with articles starting with the very first publication and his sharing of knowledge was eagerly anticipated with each issue.

Werner Zahn received the title of master of purebred pigeon breeding by the VDT in 1990 and has been an Emeritus Master in the BDRG since 2001. He was also honored for 50 years Membership in the local club of Hessen-Nassau.

Over the course of his life, the Saxon Wing Pigeon population continued to grow his lofts. But there were also Saxon Swallows, German Double Crested Trumpeters, Saxon Field Color Pigeons, German Modenas and also, very early and successfully, he bred the long-beaked Magpie Tumblers, and whose breeders still know Werner today.

In fact, Werner Zahn was a bridge between East and West. At a time when the Cold War was raging, he wasn't interested in politics, but pursued his passion without allowing himself to be restricted and maintained his contacts from East Germany all the way to California. Honors and titles didn't really interest him but there was no distance too far for him to travel in order to see beautiful pigeons. Always honest, he often told people what they didn't want to hear and at the same time, he was also a great diplomat.

Werner Zahn died on October 27, 2023 at the age of 87. A few days before his death he said: "I have had a fulfilling and really beautiful life."

One cannot expect a better life! I hope and wish that in the new world Werner will be reunited with his old friends and companions who have already left, and can continue his beautiful life.
